## **1. Summary**

After the successful completion of this year's project, based on outstanding teamwork and drive from the involved clubs, we have decided to pursue a follow-up project of similar scope and vision, which would benefit the Foreign Language High School "Bertolt Brecht". Having the experience of this year's project behind us, we feel that we should continue our pursuit to better the education resources of young people in this underprivileged environment, who are looking for ways to expand their perspectives and gain the best education they can in order to face the challenges ahead. We also will approve this project to be a District wide initiative, which will involve not only Rotary and Rotaract Clubs but also Interact clubs from the area. We wish to expose Interact to international initiatives at an early stage and to better prepare them to become active Rotaract members and Rotarians in the future.

The objective of the project is to bring the high school students closer to up-to-date technology and to expose them to different opportunities for personal advancement available on the Internet and through various computer programs. The school's history of successful students is a testament to the ability and potential of the students attending the school. We believe that through our joint efforts we can greatly enhance the educational experience and opportunities for the students of the Foreign Language High School "Bertolt Brecht" in Pazardjik, Bulgaria.

## **2. Project Details**

### ***2.1. Description***

The goals of the project are to raise sufficient funds to equip two small computer labs at the Foreign Language High School "Bertolt Brecht", which was achieved at the Mathematical High School, There labs will contain 20 desktop computers each. Additional equipment such as scanners, faxes, projectors and printers will also be bought in order to assist in teaching students how use to various technologies and to assist the actual academic process. Volunteers from Stanford Rotaract, Palo Alto Rotaract, BCC Rotaract and potentially from Interact clubs involved in this worthy initiative will be going to Bulgaria during the spring of 2007 to install the computers and connect them to the Internet in order to create countless opportunities for the students there. Another aspect of the project involves the creation of workshops addressing the various education systems found in different countries. Volunteers will be answering questions about application processes at different institutions, challenges of adapting to new environments and the post graduation.
